**We are pleased to welcome you to the seventh edition of the St Mark's C of E all-through school project newsletter, keeping you informed of the progress so far and what is happening next.**

## What has been happening on site....

We have finished the further works to complete the sewer connections on Shirley Road.

### New sports building

Groundworks to form the foundations is now complete, along with the erection of the steel frame.

### Primary school wing

The concrete frame has now been formed, along with the erection of the steel frame for the primary wing's new school hall. The external

envelope works are underway, along with the internal drylining to form the rooms.

### Secondary school wing

Works continue for the formation of the concrete frame and we are now on to the construction of the roof.

We continue to strictly monitor and manage any potential noise and dust to mitigate any disruption.

## What is coming up....

### New sports building

Completion of the roof and ground floor slab, allowing the start of the external envelope, scaffolding and brickwork to follow.

### Primary school wing

Installation of the windows, scaffolding and brickwork to the external envelope. Continuation and completion of the roofing works.

Internally, we will continue with the fit-out with mechanical & electrical services and formation of the new

classrooms and teaching spaces; preparing them for final finishes.

### Secondary school wing

Completion of the concrete frame with dismantling and removal of the tower crane. Commencement of the external envelope works, comprising of window installations, scaffolding and brickwork mid-August.

Internally, commencement of forming internal walls and start of the mechanical & electrical installation mid-August.

## Proposals for an Active Travel Zone around St Mark's C of E School

The St Mark's Active Travel Zone proposals address concerns over through-traffic, speeding and parking in the area which were raised by the local community in the perceptions survey in December 2020, and co-design workshops in March 2021.

The most popular measures for improving the area around St Mark's C of E School for walking and cycling have undergone a cost analysis, and detailed designs have been prepared. A summary of the proposals has been distributed to over 4,700 addresses in the area in a leaflet, along with computer generated images of the four key locations: Malmesbury Road / Charlton Road; Shirley Road / Malmesbury Road; Shirley Road / Cawte Road / Dyer Road and Howard Road / Stafford Road / Suffolk Avenue.

Work on a range of measures in Phase 1 of the scheme is scheduled to start in autumn 2021.

Some of the proposed measures require a formal consultation with residents before they can go ahead and residents living near one of these have been contacted by letter with details of the consultation process.

On June the 9th we launched our new school logo which will be our official logo from September 2022.

The logo's contemporary design incorporates the sea of Southampton in the wave of the S and the diocese in the representation of the Holy Trinity within the triangles of the M.

The colours within the design are linked to the different elements of the school within the building design.

The school is underpinned by the purple (primary) and the blue represents the secondary at the peak of their education and protectors of the youngest in our community.

The yellow within gives a reference to the school built on our strong traditional values.
